



He Is Alive!

Jesus is alive! Let's thank God for that! You can pray your own prayer or use the one below.

"Dear God, I am thankful Jesus is alive! I am so grateful that You sent Jesus to earth to live and teach others about how to love and bring peace. I am so excited to celebrate that Jesus is alive this week. Thank you for all you do! Amen."

Jesus came to be our Savior.



Jesus and His friends were traveling to Jerusalem.

Before they arrived, Jesus sent two of His disciples ahead to find a donkey and her colt and bring them back. The disciples did what Jesus asked and brought back the donkey and her colt.

The crowds gathered to see Jesus! They were so excited. They WAVED their palm branches. Wave those branches, friends.

They tossed down their coats to make a path for Jesus. As Jesus walked by, they shouted, "Hosanna! Hosanna!"

Can you say that as you wave your palm branches? "Hosanna! Hosanna!"

Hosanna means, "Save us, we pray." It's a way to praise or cheer for Jesus! Everyone say, "Yay, Jesus!" And that's what they did. The crowds cheered! They knew that Jesus was the Savior God had promised.

- 1. Jesus taught and healed people as He traveled across the land. (true)
- 2. Jesus' friends stopped on the Mount of Grapes. (false: They stopped on the Mount of Olives.)
- 3. Jesus became more and more popular and the religious leaders encouraged and supported Him. (false: The religious leaders became upset/were afraid of losing their power/wanted to get rid of Jesus.)
- 4. Jesus told His disciples to go ahead of Him and bring Him back a donkey and her colt. (true)
- 5. The prophet Zachary described a king who would ride in on a donkey's colt. (false: The prophet's name was Zechariah.)
- 6. As Jesus rode in, people tossed down their coats and palm branches to make a path for Jesus. (true)
- 7. The crowd shouted, "Hosanna! . . . Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord!" (Matthew 21:9, NIrV). (true)
- 8. Jesus rode in on a horse, showing Himself to be the Savior who God had promised. (false: Jesus rode in on a donkey's colt.)
- 9. God promised to send a Savior, and did. (true)
- 10. God will never make a promise and break it. (true)
