


Use the letters on the shells below to fill in the missing letters from today's verse.



Rice

Rice is a staple food in the Philippines and across much of Asia, meaning that it is a main part of the diet. Most meals in the Philippines include rice. It's usually eaten with something else, like fish or a vegetable.

Rice is grown in special flooded fields called paddies. The water is contained on the fields with rows of dirt to form layered fields called terraces. This style of farming allows enough soil and water to be contained to grow rice even on the sides of mountains! There are several regions in the Philippines that grow and harvest rice.

Workers in a rice paddy in the Philippines.


These terraces are believed to have been hand-carved into the Philippine mountains 2,000 years ago to plant rice.

Today I flew for nearly 15 hours on an airplane to the capital city of the Philippines, Nearly two million people live in this giant city!
People from the Philippines are called Filipinos. Many Filipinos speak English, but the main local language is called
Some of the missionaries we met are second-generation missionaries to the Philippines—that means their parents were missionaries there so they grew up in the country and have chosen to spend their lives in the Philippines telling people about Jesus too! One of the missionaries celebrated her 10th birthday or in the middle of the Pacific Ocean as her family was going to the Philippines to be missionaries!
one of the ways they reach out to families is through a
ministry where they teach children who may not be able to go to school how to read and write. The children's families are required to attend Bible study in order for their kids to attend the school.
We got to meet a missionary who was a Navy pilot and met his wife while he was stationed in the Philippines. They started a
in a village near the Navy base so they could tell people about Jesus even before they were full-time missionaries!
The missionaries even had to postpone their wedding plans because nearby Mt. Pinatubo and caused much destruction in their
area. I am reminded that missionaries need our prayers for many situations that can affect their lives and ministries!
