

TRIUMPHAL ENTRY

BIBLE PASSAGE: Matthew 21:1-11

FOCUS VERSES: Zechariah 9:9; Psalm 118:25-26;
Romans 6:23; Acts 16:31

Summary: Jesus rode into Jerusalem on a donkey, fulfilling the prophecy of Zechariah that said the coming King, or Messiah, would humbly enter on a donkey. As Jesus rode into Jerusalem, the crowds spread cloaks and branches and shouted "Hosanna!" to honor Him. The people celebrated that Jesus was the King God promised!

Kids will be given the opportunity to reflect on the truth they learned about God and respond accordingly.



MONTHLY MEMORY VERSE

THE PRODIGAL SON

(Luke 15:11–24)

Week 1

Brite Idea: Jesus never stops loving us.

He Question: Can there be an end to God's love?

God is love. His love is not based on anything we do or don't do. It never ends and never gives up.

We Question: Does God care about people who are far from Him?

God loves every single person. He wants people who are far from Him to turn away from sin, return to Him and trust in Jesus as Savior.

THE TEN LEPERS

(Luke 17:11–19)

Week 2

Brite Idea: Jesus loves everyone.

He Question: Is there anyone Jesus doesn't love?

Jesus loves every single person, no matter who they are and what they've done. Even if the whole world rejects someone, Jesus loves them.

We Question: How can we respond to Jesus' love?

We can respond to Jesus with praise and gratefulness for all He does for us.

Week 3

CLEANSING OF THE TEMPLE

(Matthew 21:12–17; Mark 11:15–18)

Week 4

Brite Idea: Jesus loves what is right.

He Question: How is Jesus righteous?

Jesus is completely good and does nothing wrong. He loves what is right and always follows God's way.

We Question: Is God angry when we sin?

Sin does make God angry because He is righteous, but He always loves us. When we trust in Jesus as Savior, He takes our sin and gives us His righteousness. God sees the righteousness of Jesus in us.

JUDAS BETRAYS JESUS

(Luke 22:1–6, 39–53; John 13:1–17)

Week 5

Brite Idea: Jesus loves us while we are still sinners.


He Question: Does Jesus know what we do?

Jesus knows everything about us, including everything we think, say and do, yet He still loves us.

We Question: How does Jesus feel about us when we sin?

Jesus loves us always, no matter what. However, because He loves us, He wants us to ask forgiveness and seek to live life His way.
