BIBLE PASSAGE: Acts 18:18–28

FOCUS VERSES: Acts 17:25; John 1:4; Hebrews 13:16; Ephesians 4:29

Summary: After ministering in Corinth, Paul left for Syria. A married couple of believers, named Priscilla and Aquila, went with him. Priscilla and Aquila stayed in Ephesus while Paul went to Syria. Priscilla and Aquila encountered a man named Apollos. Apollos was courageously speaking about Jesus in the synagogue, but there were some things that he did not

yet understand about Jesus. The couple took Apollos aside and explained the way of God to him more accurately. Apollos then went on to share the Gospel with many other people.

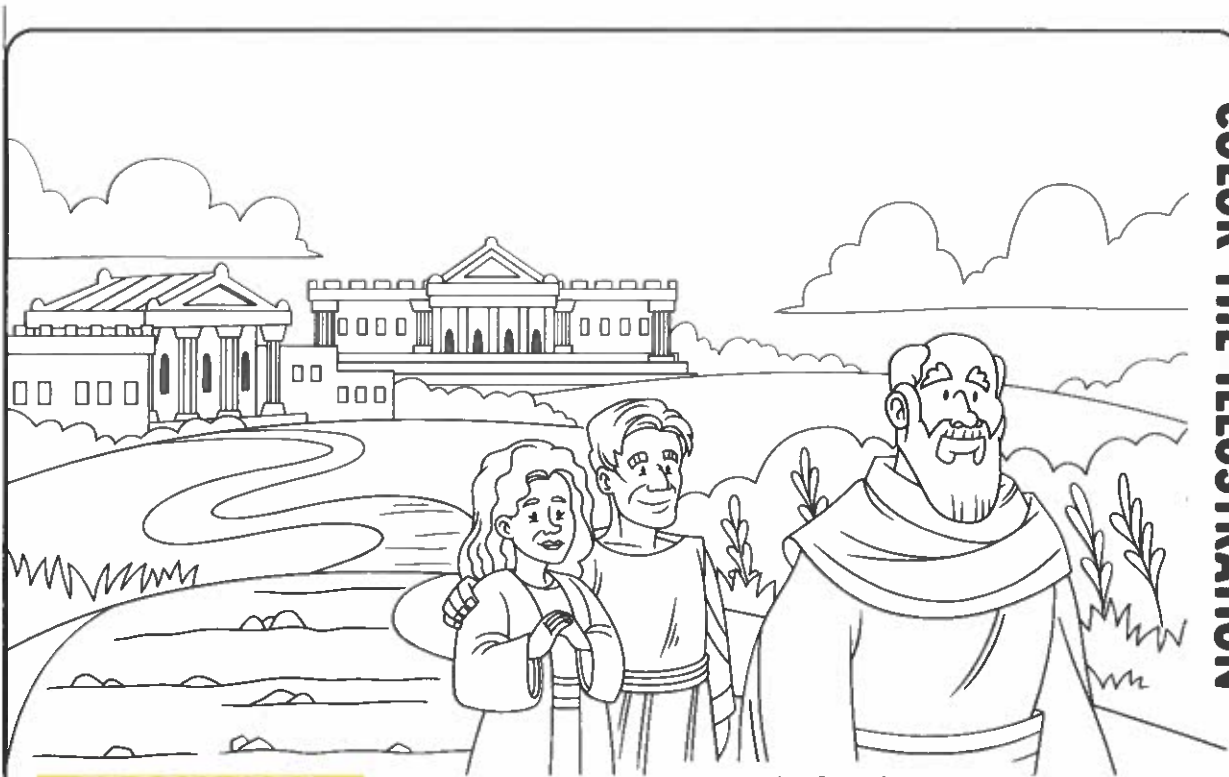

Week 1

Brite Idea: God's way is the best.

He Question: Why is God's way best?

Week 2

Brite Idea: God seeks us out.

He Question: Why does God seek people out?

God is love. He loves people and desires for everyone everywhere to know, love and serve Him.

We Question: How can other people know God?

God can use us to share the Gospel, or His good news, with others so they can have a relationship with Him.

PETER'S RESCUE

(Acts 12:3-19)

Week 3

Brite Idea: God is powerful.

He Question: How powerful is God?

God is omnipotent—all-powerful. There is nothing He can't do.

We Question: What can we do when we are in a bad situation?

We can trust God is always with us and there is nothing that is too hard for Him.

PAUL IN ATHENS

(Acts 17:16-34)

Week 4

Brite Idea: God is the one true God.

He Question: How many gods are there?

There is only one true God. The Lord is the Creator of everything and is in control of all creation.

We Question: Why do people worship things other than God?

Sometimes people don't know the truth or they choose to focus on things they can see or touch. Only God is worthy of worship.
