



ABRAM AND LOT

BIBLE PASSAGE: Genesis 12–15

FOCUS VERSES: Lamentations 3:22–23; Nahum 1:7;
Psalm 147:8

Summary: God made a covenant with Abram and told him to leave his country and travel to a new place. Abram left and took his nephew Lot. After a while, there wasn't enough room for both Abram's and Lot's flocks and herds. Abram let Lot pick which land to take. Lot took what appeared to be the best land for himself, but God reminded Abram of His promise. Lot ended up in trouble, but Abram rescued him.

HE

WHAT IS GOD IN CONTROL OF?

Kids will be given the opportunity to reflect on the truth they learned about God and respond accordingly.



TAKE-HOME

ABRAM AND LOT

(GENESIS 12-15) God made a covenant with Abram, telling him to go to a new land. Abram let Lot choose land first. Lot chose the best but later needed rescuing. God reminded Abram of His promise and faithfulness.

POINT TO JESUS: Trusting in God's goodness, Abram showed grace to Lot by seeking him out and rescuing him, even though it was Lot's own fault that he was captured. We are also in a mess that is our own fault. Our sin traps us and keeps us from having a relationship with God, but God sent His Rescuer, Jesus, to seek us out and rescue us even though we don't deserve it.

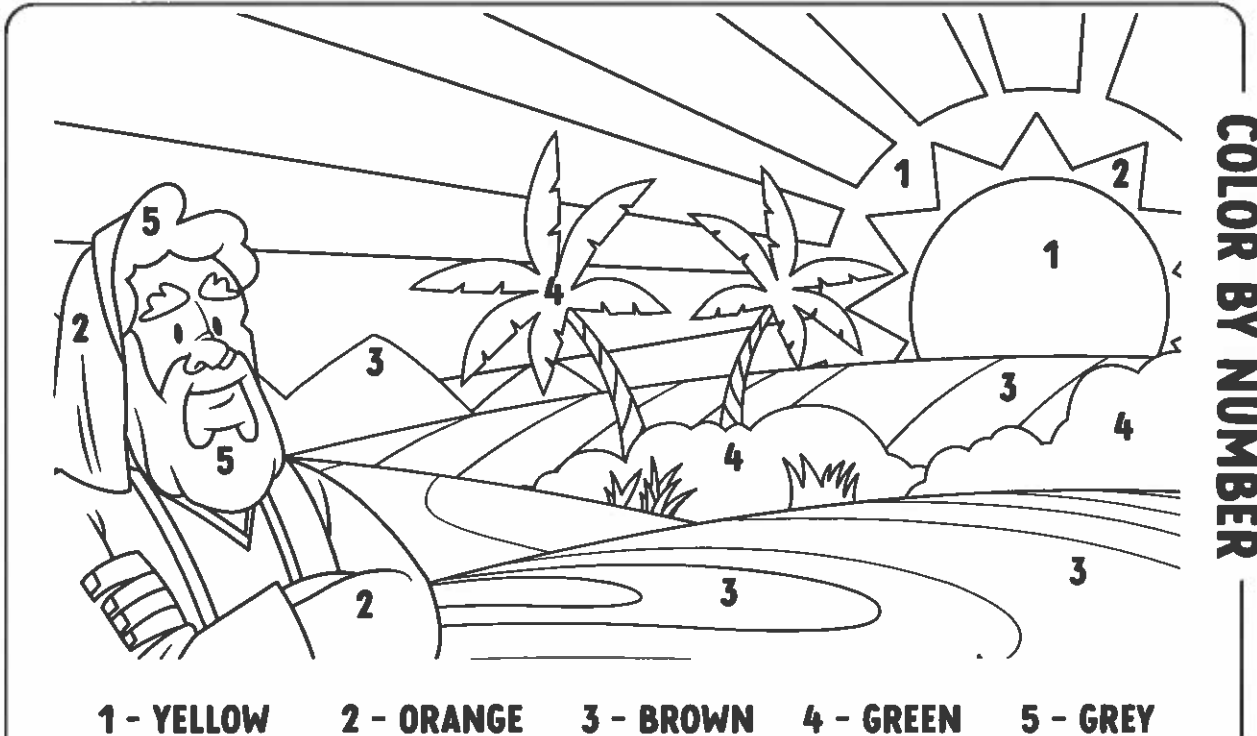

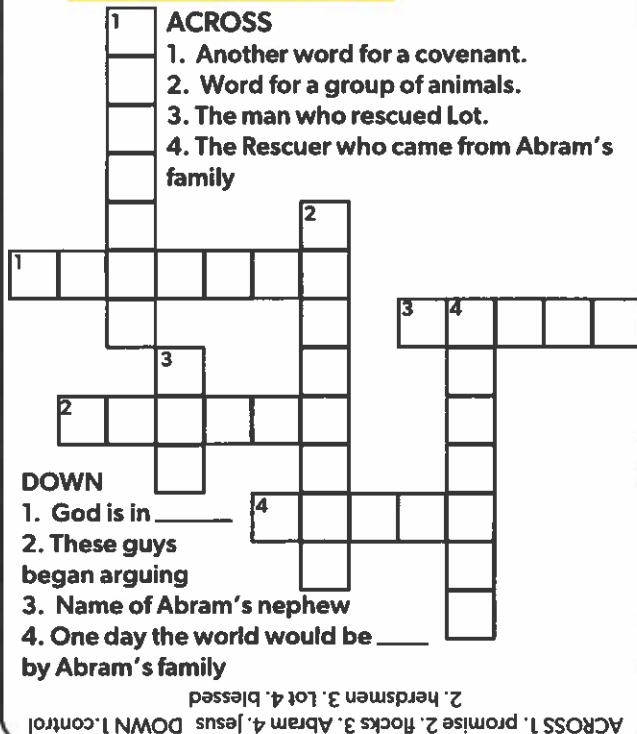

CREATION *(Genesis 1)*

Week 1



The world was empty and formless. Then God spoke and created everything. He called all creation good and still rules over it today.

Brite Idea: God is the Creator of everything.

WONDERFULLY MADE *(Genesis 1:26–31; 2:4–25)*

Week 2



God made Adam and Eve in His image and placed them in the Garden of Eden. God told Adam not to eat from the tree of knowledge. They lived in a perfect relationship with God.

Brite Idea: God created people in His image.

THE FALL *(Genesis 3)*

Week 3



A serpent tempted Eve. She and Adam disobeyed God and ate fruit from the tree. The perfect world was broken by their sin. God promised a Savior who would defeat sin forever.

Brite Idea: God is holy, but people sin.

TOWER OF BABEL *(Genesis 11:1–9)*

Week 4
